#### The Printing of the Bull's Heads

Various technical aspects of the printing process are still unclear and some speculation remains, however the general view is that the First Moldavia Issues were printed on manual presses delivered from Georg Sigl Company in Vienna in 1856 for embossing fiscal excise stamps impressions on paper sheets.

When it was decided to produce the Bull's Head postage stamps in 1858, the printing dies of the Bull's Heads (see illustration 1) replaced the excise embossing dies. The Bull's Heads must have been printed one after another. Two horizontal rows of 8 stamps each on the first half of the sheet. Then the sheet was turned at 180° and another two rows of 8 stamps each were printed on the remaining unprinted lower part of the sheet. This labour intensive and relatively un-skilled method of printing caused the 2nd and 3rd inner rows of the Post Office Sheet to be placed inverted to each other creating eight tête-beche pairs on the completed sheet of 32 impressions.





Unfortuntely no illustration of a Georg Sigl hand printing machine is available. But it can be assumed, that the 'Schlesinger's Patent Commercial Stamp Printing Press' (see illustration 2 & 3) with self inking roller, was of a very similar design. We have arranged a nearly ready printed sheet of a Bull's Head stamp illustrating how the printing could have commenced.

The Schlesinger's users manual read: Turn the Lever handle A <u>up not down</u> and you will cause the Roller B to slide under the moveable Die C, the springs will bring the Lever back to it's original position, then push the same handle down on your paper or on what you wish to stamp and your impression will be perfect.
